## Risk Assessment for School Excursions

A Risk assessment of the Historical Village has been conducted to assess any risks that may affect excursions. As a result of this assessment it has been determined that no child should come to grief if adequately supervised. We ask that all schools have a ratio of 1 adult to every 10 students. However in order to encourage supervision and ease the cost on schools we allow 1 adult to every 5 students into the Village free of charge, however any more adults than this are charged at students prices.

In this activity the wringer is chained and locked when not in use so that turning mechanism can not move. Students are advised not to use when supervisor not present. Students are only able to turn the handle of the wringer. At no time is a student able to feed the wringer. The students must wait for the supervisors O.K. before turning the handle. Other Students are kept at a safe distance.

All students entering the Village are to remain in the company and sight of their appointed supervisor. This person is responsible for the safety, well being and cohesiveness of their group. The group leader is responsible for reading the signs indicating a warning or direction. Historical Society staff will ask any student not obviously in the company of a supervisor to return to their group. No student is allowed to exit the Historical Village site without the company of a supervisor during the course of their visit. All schools are asked to have their children in uniform and/or have a name badge indicating name, school and group leader.
